After officiating at the launch ceremony, Mr Young accompanied the guests on a tour of the Hong Kong Garden. They were briefed on the garden's design and characteristics by representatives of the Architectural Services Department (ArchSD) and the LCSD.

The Hong Kong Garden was designed under the main theme "Hong Kong Style and Flavour". A tree-like architectural design, "Tree-ZE", comprising 360 mini-windmills and a rich variety of plants commonly found in Hong Kong and South China have been used to create the garden's beautiful scenery in an eco-friendly way. The project was designed and built by the ArchSD, with plants and floral displays provided by the LCSD.
